Born in Tampico, Tamaulipas, Mexico, on July 11, 1942, has lived and been educated in Mexico City, Washington and New York City.

I. Professional Activities:

Since 1989 and currently, Mr. Gutierrez Kirchner has been a practicing attorney in international labor and fiscal affairs, based in Mexico City.

During 1998 to the present he has been and is the Head of the "Alameda Historical District Trust Fund" in charge of restoring 72 blocks of ancient Mexico.

Since the inception of the vulnerable youth program in 1994, he has been Advisor to the "Fundacion Mexicana Bartolome de las Casas AC"

Mr. Gutierrez Kirchner has had experience in Washington and New York, both as Minister of the Mexican Embassy (1978 – 1982) and as Pemex' Representative in the US (1982 – 1988).

During the late 1980's was advisor, as international trade lawyer, to the Mexican Textile Chamber.

He was successful to Lobby for the authorization of the new International Bridge, west of Laredo, in the Colombia (Nuevo Leon) – Dolores (Texas) area.

While Trade Minister at the Embassy before the White House he was appointed, in 1978 economic Counsellor for Mexico, before the Organization of American States

In the late 1970's was Commissioner of Internal Revenue in Mexico.

In 1976 he participated as Founder of the US Mexico Chamber of Commerce, in Mexico City and in Washington.

From 1971 to 1976 he worked as Executive Assistant to the President of the Inter American Development Bank

During the late 1960's he was Secretary to the Tax Commission in the Department of the Treasury of Mexico.

Started his career in the early 60's working for the Labor Department of Mexico, helping ascertain the rights of disadvantaged workers.

II. Intellectual Activities:

Graduated with highest honors from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM) with the thesis Tax Reform in Mexico.

Has lectured on international trade and fiscal matters in the UNAM, Georgetown University and Getulio Vargas Foundation in Brazil.

Mr. Gutierrez Kirchner has been a writer in leading newspapers of Mexico City both in Spanish (El Universal and Macro Economia) and in English (The News).

Participated with the newspaper person Agustin Barrios Gomez in several radio and TV news and opinion programs.

Wrote the chapter on Mexican Labor Law for the legal Internet Service of Paul Curtis Esquire of Des Moines Iowa.

While working for the restoration of Mexico City Historical Center, has been involved in the governing body of the Popular Art Museum.

Presented the development plan of the Alameda district in Mexico City before the world meeting of Mayors (over 100) in Barcelona in 1999.

III. Political Activities:

Mr. Gutierrez Kirchner, in late 1981 participated in the campaign of Miguel de la Madrid to become President of Mexico.

Mr. Gutierrez Kirchner, in 1987 helped in the campaign of Mario Ramon Beteta to become Governor of the State of Mexico.

Participated in the political Campaigns of Mr. Cuauhtemoc Cardenas in 1988, 1994 and 2000 and is involved with the same candidate for 2006.

In 1997 worked successfully in the campaign of Mr. Cuauhtemoc Cardenas, in order to become the first elected Mayor of Mexico City.

Has been appointed head of balloting boxes in a series of elections in Mexico during the last 20 years.
